#3 Let's Just See It

Jacob sees God's Face:

"But," God said, "you cannot see my face, for no one may see me and live."

Exodus 33:20

#4 Let's Just Own It

Jacob Sustains an injury...." Hip and a Hop"

- On the one hand it signifies *Jacob's success*. He has struggled and he got what he wanted, needed...**A blessing**. He now knows that God's presence will always be with him, and he will never be alone. He is striving with God. So Jacob is not a victim.
- On the other hand it testifies to **God's grace..** Jacob has wrestled with God until the twilight of the day, and seen the face of God ...and his life is spared. So the "mark" symbolizes both who Jacob is and who God is.
