Abel – offered a better sacrifice **by faith** and was commended as righteous

Enoch – **by faith** he pleased God, so he never experienced death

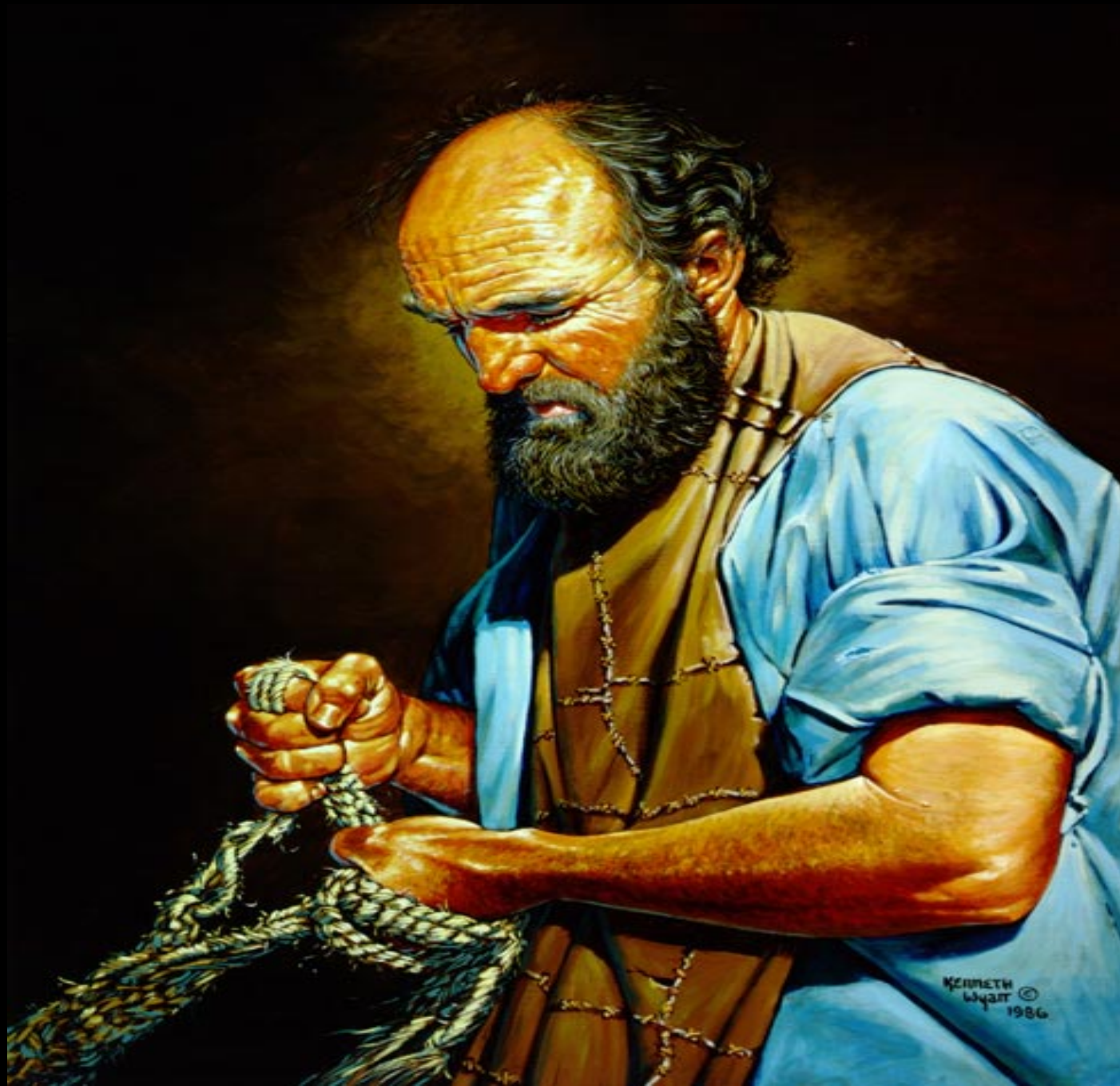

The Andrew Profile

- Andrew was a disciple of Christ.
- He was from the city of Bethsaida near the region of the Sea of Galilee. (John 1:44)
- He and his brother Peter were fisherman.
- He introduced his brother Peter to Jesus. (John 1:41-42)
- He was a disciple of John the Baptist before becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ. (John 1:35-40)

- He was involved in the feeding of a multitude by calling Jesus attention to the boy who had the loaves and fish.
(John 6:5-9)
- Andrew (along with Philip) introduced some Greeks to Jesus.
(John 12:20-22)
- Andrew inquired of Jesus regarding the destruction of the temple.
(Mark 13:3-4)
- He was among the disciples who gathered in the upper room after they had receive the power of the Holy Spirit.
(Acts 1:13)



The **Quiet Servants** seek to do what is right. They show up. Open doors. Cook dinners. Visit the sick. You seldom see them in front of an audience. Typically that is the last place they want to be.
