
BACKPACKS4KIDS

STEWARDSHIP

A Financial Update

Here's a quick update on New Covenant's finances for the first half of 2021. Offerings for the first 6 months were \$1,495,600, which is ahead of last year by \$22,000.

Total income is down \$37,100, mainly due to the lack of concerts and other similar activities which we normally have in the first part of the year.

The directors have continued to keep expenses below budget. Our ministry expenses to date are \$329,500, which is \$82,400 below budget,

and our total church-wide expenses were \$1,504,500, which are \$220,300 below budget and \$157,891 less than in 2020.

Our mortgage and apportionment payments have all been made timely and are current. Our mortgage balance at the end of June was \$1,253,316.

The above amounts do not include the purchase of the new sound system which was paid for with the remaining PPP loan proceeds and reserve funds. The Helping Hands Ministry financial activity, which includes the Bargains & Blessings thrift store, are not included as well.




