The Refuge at Jumper Creek began in 2005. The Refuge is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that provides housing, mentoring, life-skill education, and referrals to community partners in a faith-based environment for families who are homeless.

The Refuge assists residents to develop healthy, realistic goals while equipping them with the skill set necessary to make positive life changing choices to reach their full potential and self-sufficiency.



The Refuge meets these goals by partnering with many different churches and community organizations. There are currently 9 families for a total of 42 individuals living at The Refuge.


In response, God said, "Where is My honor?... Where is My reverence?" (Malachi 1:6, NKJV). He viewed this as dishonoring to Him and it was.


