

We are seeking volunteers to write note cards to the teachers and staff at Wildwood Middle High School and Sumter P.R.E.P. Academy.


We would like just a short note encouraging those returning to work during these uncertain

Sacred Stories are testimonies about how Jesus has impacted congregants' lives. They will begin Wednesday premiering after Sacred Songs.






JOHN ED MATHISON'S STUDY

Dr. John Ed Mathison retired in June 2008 after serving 36 years as senior minister of Frazer Memorial United Methodist Church in Montgomery, Alabama. Under his leadership, Frazer grew from 400 members to 9,000 and had the largest Sunday School attendance for United Methodist churches in America. In 2006, The Church Reporter magazine recognized Frazer as the 25th most influential church in America.


