
HOLY LAND TRIP










STATIC CLING WINDOW DECAL

Tax-free Giving through IRAs

For those who are 70-1/2 and older, there is a provision in the IRS code that allows you to make charitable gifts directly from your Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA) without having to pay taxes that would otherwise be due. Although a special pandemic provision for 2020 waived the Requirement Minimum Distribution (RMD), it is still possible to make tax-free donations from your IRA for 2020.
