Since his retirement, he has actually been Interim Senior Pastor at two other churches. At Heritage UMC in Clearwater for 16 months, he helped lead a capital fund/debt retirement campaign of \$1.2 million, refurbished the church parking so they could renew the monthly community family skate night, restored the administrative structure, and started a new worship service. At Pasadena Community Church in St. Petersburg for a year, he restored the administrative structure, established a Vision team, and replaced all five roofs on the original building, which allowed refurbishment of the youth/children and choir rooms that had been damaged by leaks.

Prior to retirement, for 22 years, he was the Senior Minister of Trinity UMC in Gainesville, a 4,000 member church, and from 1986 to 1994, he was the Senior Minister of the at-the-time fastest-growing UMC in Florida, Indian River City UMC, which during those eight years, grew from 750 to 1800 members, with worship attendance growing from 300 to 1,000.


