A Lay Servant Is...

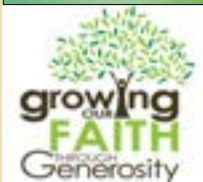
- An active, supportive member of a United Methodist church

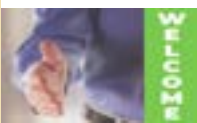
