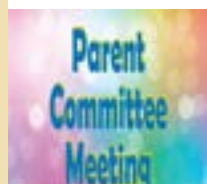

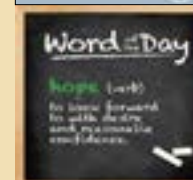

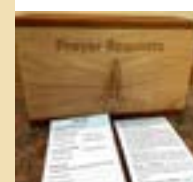
Alzheimer's Care Give Support Group
