
Floral Cross

Perhaps you have offered a prayer at the altar for someone who will be receiving one of the beautiful quilts created by our Lake Deaton Prayer Quilt Ministry or the Summerhill Prayers & Squares Ministry. What we also want you to know is that a great deal of effort goes into creating these tangible expressions of love and prayer. These quilts are being made by a dedicated group in our church who envision the quilts being a special gift of love for those who may be ill, facing surgery, or difficult family situations — for many different reasons — but each for someone in special need of prayer.

When they are delivered, each recipient knows they are being "wrapped" in the comforting, enveloping presence of God, lifted up in prayers, and surrounded by your love. We want you to also know the threads that you see woven into each quilt have a special purpose. When you see the quilts displayed at the altar, as you pray we ask you to tie a knot in the thread so that the recipient knows that they have been, and will continue to be, covered in prayer.

If you have received a quilt, you already know what a blessing it provides. If you have requested a quilt, you have seen the appreciation in the eyes of the receiver. If you know of a person in need, it is possible to request a quilt through our website or by filling out a Prayer Quilt Request Card (found in the attendance pads). It can be put into the offering plate, placed in a Prayer Concern Box (in the East or West Narthex and in the vestibules as you leave the Christian Life Center), or turned in to the Congregational Care Office.

If you want to volunteer to be a part of this powerful ministry, please contact the Congregational Care Office. Donations are also appreciated to help offset the costs involved in making the quilts.


Early Response Team Certification

All Things New — Women's Bible Study


Tuesdays, September 24–November 12 from 11 a.m.–1 p.m.

Reserve your spot for August's Prime Time. We will have a sing-a-long with Pat Smith and Brian Maderos, a devotional, and a special literary-themed program!


